Membership Terms and Conditions

Membership Term	CEBA members must renew their membership at the beginning of each calendar year. CEBA will send a renewal invoice approximately 60 days prior to the end of the calendar year. Renewal is voluntary. Should a member fail to pay the annual membership fee within 90 days of receipt, CEBA may terminate its membership. By renewing its membership, a member agrees to be bound by CEBA's Membership Terms and Conditions, which may be amended from time to time. CEBA's Membership Terms and Conditions may be found on CEBA's website.
Fees	CEBA members agree to pay the annual membership fee applicable to their selected tier. Membership fees are not deductible as charitable contributions under the Internal Revenue. CEBA members should confer with their tax counsel to determine whether the fee is deductible as a business expense
Membership Policies	<p>CEBA is open to companies that have demonstrated a commitment to reduce their carbon emissions from energy use. Under CEBA's open membership policy, companies from carbon intensive or energy-intensive sectors may join CEBA. To qualify for membership, companies in those sectors must demonstrate the same commitment to reducing emissions as companies from noncarbon-intensive sectors. By accepting a company into membership, CEBA is not explicitly or implicitly endorsing a company's specific actions to reduce emissions. CEBA member companies should not use their membership as a display of excellence in achieving carbon reduction goals.</p> <p>CEBA members are governed by and subject to the CEBA Bylaws, available on CEBA's website and are subject to change from time to time.</p>
Non-Solicitation and Business Development	CEBA seeks to build a community of peers across industries to work together to accelerate clean energy transactions in the market and to overcome the barriers to clean energy market activity. CEBA recognizes that many of its members have business relationships, or seek business relationships, with one another. However, CEBA discourages direct, commercial, member-to-member solicitation through official CEBA platforms (events, webinars, written communications, etc.), as such direct sales can inhibit the free, open dialogue required to collectively solve market failures.



Antitrust	Members must comply with all antitrust laws that govern CEBA, including the anti-trust compliance policies and guidelines adopted by CEBA. Nothing in this Agreement, the CEBA Bylaws, Certificate of Incorporation or any CEBA program or activity shall be construed to require, permit, or condone conduct that violates antitrust law.
Brand Use	CEBA's practice is to make its member list public, and accordingly, CEBA may publish the names and/or logos of member companies for purposes of illustrating membership participation alongside other members. Examples include "logo clouds," list format on CEBA's website, membership brochures, membership event invitations. CEBA will seek a member's express permission for any other use of the member's brand assets. CEBA members in good standing may include the CEBA logo, a statement of membership, and/or a link to the CEBA website on their company's website. IP Use	All CEBA products and other intellectual property developed by or on behalf of CEBA are CEBA's sole property unless otherwise expressly agreed in writing by CEBA. CEBA reserves the right to make CEBA IP publicly accessible on a case-by-case basis. CEBA members agree to not share CEBA products or IP outside of CEBA without the express written consent of CEBA.
Termination	CEBA members may terminate their membership for any reason upon fifteen (15) days' written notice to CEBA. CEBA may terminate any membership upon a determination by CEBA's CEO or board of directors that the member no longer meets the requirements for membership. A member is not entitled to a refund of any membership fees or other amounts paid as a result of termination of its membership.
