## Committees and Working Groups

At the Leader and Advocate membership levels, CEBA provides unique and valuable insights as well as opportunities to engage with other members and demonstrate leadership, while helping shape the organization's work. At these premier levels, members are eligible to participate in several committees and working groups.

### Available Committees and Working Groups

- **Buyer Policy Council (BPC)**

The Buyer Policy Council provides a monthly *buyers-only* space for peer-to-peer conversations, confidential discussions, and strategy-setting. The BPC offers buyer members the opportunity to help drive decision-making on critical policy matters and engage in robust dialogue to identify policy solutions that can move with greater momentum.

- **Federal Policy Committee**

The Federal Policy Committee engages members through monthly meetings, as well as ad hoc briefings and surveys to gather input on proposed U.S. federal laws and regulations affecting carbon emissions-free energy production, procurement, and enabling technologies such as storage and transmission. Member feedback will inform CEBA's policy positions and advocacy strategies.

- **Transmission Policy Committee**

The Transmission Policy Committee meets monthly to engage members on policy and regulatory topics involving transmission planning (regional and interregional) and generator interconnection, primarily in PJM and MISO, with secondary coverage of the West, the Southeast, and SPP.

- **Western Policy Committee**

The Western Policy Committee focuses on improving customer access to clean energy through wholesale market expansion, promoting regional transmission coordination, and supporting policies that advance low-cost, reliable, carbon emissions-free energy in the West. The committee meets monthly.

- **Southeast Policy Committee**

The Southeast Policy Committee focuses on market solutions, utility programs, and policy advocacy in the region. The committee meets monthly to develop and implement strategies like clean tariffs, Integrated Resource Plans (IRPs), and innovative procurement models to drive systemic change and accelerate decarbonization across the region.

- **Government Affairs Committee**

CEBA's Government Affairs (GA) Committee is a great opportunity for the GA team to share intelligence, describe actions they are taking, and gather feedback from CEBA's membership. The committee meets every other Tuesday, holding a focused discussion about what we are working on, who we are meeting with, what we're considering, and how we can best serve members.

- **Supply Chain Working Group**

The Supply Chain Working Group focuses on ways to advance innovative, scalable solutions for supply chain engagement and decarbonization. Through discussions that feature expert guest speakers, educational sessions, and active workshopping, the working group considers best practices for traditional supplier engagement strategies alongside emerging methods to accelerate impact. Across its engagements, the working group fosters a community of peers and partner companies who are collectively navigating similar challenges, creating a trusted network for sharing insights, troubleshooting barriers, and collaborating on approaches to drive meaningful change. The working group meets every other month.

- **Data Centers Working Group**

The Data Centers Working Group aims to drive the adoption of carbon emissions-free electricity solutions in data centers. The working group discusses topics ranging from clean firm energy procurement and portfolio building to community and utility engagement, through discussions with expert guest speakers, educational sessions, and active workshopping. With participation from diverse stakeholders across the data center value chain, the working group fosters intentional connections between energy buyers and providers dedicated to decarbonizing the data center industry. The working group meets every other month.

- **Accounting & Reporting Standing Committee**

The Accounting & Reporting Standing Committee focuses on shaping existing and evolving greenhouse gas accounting and/or carbon accounting and reporting standards. Committee members tackle major developments of established standards like the GHG Protocol and Science Based Targets initiative, as well as emerging topics such as consequential accounting and new frameworks. The committee serves to educate members and channel input to CEBA, allowing members to directly engage with CEBA to get early insights and help shape CEBA's positions.

- **Global Policy Committee**

The Global Policy Committee will engage members through monthly meetings and newsletter communications to share market and policy knowledge and insights, establish program priorities, and identify potential engagements and activities. Member engagement will inform CEBA's priorities and messaging in the Asia-Pacific region.

### **CEBA Advisory Board**

Individuals participating in any standing committees and working groups also have the opportunity to participate in CEBA's Advisory Board. This unique forum will offer networking and business development opportunities with other CEBA Advocate and Leader members, as well as information sharing from the working groups and committees.

## **Additionally, Leader and Advocate members have access to two a la carte opportunities:**

- **The Academy Committee**

The Academy Committee engages members through regular virtual meetings focused on shaping upcoming digital and in-person supplier training and engagement in the AsiaPacific region as part of the Clean Energy Procurement Academy. Committee members provide input on program design and strategic priorities, helping guide the Academy's offerings, geographic focus, and overall strategy. Participation in the Academy Committee is available to members who provide an additional funding contribution. The Academy Committee holds a monthly virtual meeting, with a dedicated APAC-friendly call each month.

- **Texas Energy Buyers Alliance**

The Texas Energy Buyers Alliance (TEBA) is CEBA's state chapter in Texas. TEBA works on market design, interconnection, transmission, and regulatory issues in the state. TEBA offers Steering Committee- and Supporter-level memberships. The Steering Committee meets monthly as the decision-making and strategy body, and a monthly all-member meeting provides tracking and readouts on policy and regulatory developments.
